DISABLED AMERICAN VETERANS

PEN BLANK PROCEDURES

NOTE: THIS PROCEDURE IS FOR 7MM SLIMLINE OR FUNLINE PENS

1. ROUGH THE OUTSIDE OF THE BRASS TUBES WITH SANDPAPER.
2. CUT THE WOOD FOR THE BLANK $3/4 \times 3/4$ BY 5 INCHES LONG.
3. CUT TWO PIECES FROM THIS BLANK TO 2 AND $3/16$ INCHES LONG. (TRY TO KEEP THESE TOGETHER FOR GRAIN AND COLOR MATCHING THROUGH OUT THIS PROCEDURE).
4. DRILL A 7MM HOLE THROUGH THE LENGTH OF THE BLANKS. (TRY TO DRILL THROUGH THE CENTER OF THE BLANKS). A DRILL PRESS AND CLAMPING DEVICE WORKS WELL.
5. USING MEDIUM C.A. GLUE OR FIVE MINUTE EPOXY, COAT THE TUBE AND INSERT IT INTO THE DRILLED BLANK. (SOME WOOD SHOULD EXTEND BEYOND THE ENDS OF THE BRASS TUBE.)
6. THE ENDS OF THE BLANKS ARE THEN TRIMMED BACK TO THE BRASS TUBES. PENN STATE MAKES A BARREL TRIMMING SYSTEM OR SKIP THIS STEP UNTIL AFTER THE BLANKS ARE TURNED ROUND. THEY CAN THEN BE SANDED OR CUT BACK TO THE ENDS OF THE TUBE.
7. USING A PEN TURNING MANDREL ON YOUR LATHE, TURN THE BLANKS TO ROUND.
8. REMOVE THE BLANKS AND TRIM THE INSIDE BURRS FROM THE BLANKS.
9. RUBBER BAND THE MATCHING BLANKS TOGETHER AND RETURN THEM TO THE DAV COORDINATOR FOR SENDING TO THE LITTLE ROCK PEN TURNING PROGRAM.
