



3. Olive wood with an acrylic filler in voids (note the red on the right side of the base).
4. Walnut bowl. All were made by Dallas and finished with spray on polyurethane.

Dick Rickon—Spalted Hackberry hollow form. Used four coats of CA glue to fill the worm holes and five coats of polyurethane for finish.


Jeff Smith—Segmented bowl made from Canary and Paduka with a Curly Maple bottom. Finish is CA glue.
