- * TIP by Ken Higgins. To air dry bowls turned from green wood, turn walls to 1/2" to 3/4" thickness and turn it over on the top with cardboard under it. It should dry to about 15% in 3 months.

Fundamentals of Turning 101 By Kenneth Higgins

Kenneth Higgins has been making the best of the HOT days in August by turning on the air in his shop and teaching the fundamental of turning. He hosted two sessions in August—Thank you Kenneth!

August Demonstration



Joe Meskaitis demonstrated how to make a Snowman place setting. Note, Joe donates MANY items to his local VFD fundraisers. In order to duplicate pieces Joe uses lots of marking sticks and jigs!

To start the Snowman he used a 1 3/4 inch by 3 1/8 inch block. After roughing it down to a 1 5/8 inch cylinder he marked where the three V-cuts should be using a marking stick so that all Snowman will have the same body propor-

tions. Joe used a spindle gouge (not a skew) to shape the snowman body and used a sizing cut-out to help him get the right head, body sizes. To flatten the head for the hat, he uses a disk sander.

The Hat is made from a 1 inch x 1 inch piece of stock, he loaded this into a pen jaws chuck for shaping and parting off. The hat is attached to the body using a 1/8 dowel.

The Snowman's nose was made from scrap cedar and turned to match a measuring stick guide.

A 3/16th dowel is used for the sign stick and the holder is made from scrap stock 1 1/8 inch long with a slot cut for the place setting card. To drill the perfect hole for the sign stick in the Snowman a jig was used.

Americana Acrylic paint from Hobby Lobby was used for the finishing coat of paint. These have been very popular items at the VFD Christmas sale.

Dick Rickon—Redwood Burl (used Minwax Hardener to stabilize it and CA glue to seal it). Huckleberry Root , finish is 2-3 Minwax Sealer and 4 coats of Poly spray.

Steve Wagner—The blue one is a Cherry burl and the Green is Hickory with embedded pine cones. They were made using a resin filler and placing them in a pressure pot to cure.

Bill Dorzok—Lidded bowl made from Rosewood with a Walnut lid and bottom. Bowl has a Walnut base and Rosewood side. The Urn is Walnut and has a wooden threaded top. Bill used a machine lathe to cut the threads. All three items are finished with wipe on poly and then polished.
