Meeting Minutes October 9th

There were 33 members present and two visitors, Rex Gwinn and Bob Car.

Announcements:

The December meeting will be a party with no business or demonstration, but a lunch meal with members bringing the food and a show and tell. A sign up sheet was passed for members to list food items they will bring. I suspect that many will need to consult with a spouse before committing.

David Rayburn gave an update on the purchase of new video equipment project. So far, the new camera with mount and tv mount have been purchased. The demonstration today was recorded and made available on the internet at several locations. See Linda Moore emails for access details.

The club challenge for the November meeting will be turning Christmas ornaments which will be sold at the Craft Show. Two \$20 prizes will be given for best ornaments. No motions were made to be voted on.

Meeting Minutes Cont.

Demonstration:

Phil Wiles demonstrated turning a sea urchin finial ornament from white wood purchased at Lowe's using a specially sharpened spindle gouge. The finial was finished with thin CA. Sea urchins can be purchased on line from Amazon. *Richard Smeltzer, Secretary*

October Demonstration

Phil Wiles demonstrated how to make finials for a Sea Urchin Christmas ornament (which can be purchased from Amazon). He starts with a white 2x4 approximately 7" long. Running the lathe at 1800 he uses a VERY sharp spindle gouge and began roughing out the piece. He tapers the piece to the end and begins the detail work there He wants to keep the weight at the base as he is working on the end because it can become very weak. A steady hand, sharp tools and very "gentile" touch (not taking too much wood) is all that is required (sounds easy)!! Phil suggests sanding it before it gets too weak and add super glue to stiffen it up before parting the piece off.

For the bottom finial, he first fits the bottom to the Sea Urchin base and then begins to shape. He applies CA glue to the final shape before parting it off.

Wally Burr—Walnut and Cherry segmented bowl. Beautiful detail!



Terry Butler—This "OTF—Off the Floor" wood had cracks that had to be filled with coffee grounds and CA glue. The finish is Howard Wax.





Dick Rickon—Vase is made from an Apple limb and the salt and pepper cellars are made from Cedar. Finish on all is sanding sealer and Poly.



Linda Moore— Heart bowl from Walnut. Finish is Danish Oil and Carnauba Wax.





Jeff Smith—Seventy four piece segmented round Kilimba musical instrument with base made from Purpleheart and Curly Maple. It is 9 1/2" diameter by 2 1/2 tall. Finish is CA glue.

1,000 feet. It is a very
hard wood and required a lot of sharpening of tools. Finish
is CA glue
