Announcements/Discussion:

There is currently more than \$1,000 in the VA account with an additional \$741 raised at the Craft Fair (pen sales).

Dallas announced that the VA doesn't like using the dust collectors because of the noise. VA said we can have them so Dallas will pick them up for the club. Dallas also reported that he got information regarding some exotic wood for the pen blanks. Most of it is beautiful, but expensive. However, the consensus was that we have VA money and need to spend it. Steve asked Kenneth if he would assist with putting together the blanks. 




Sandy Lord and Dee Robinson showcased their first turned bowls. These bowls were a result of the training session they had with Kenneth Higgins.

Paul Pierman—Cups made from Walnut and Dogwood. Handles are carved. Paul plans to do a demonstration for the club on turning these.



Mark Lillie—Sycamore Box and a Live Edge Bowl. Finish is a sprayed lacquer.



Phil Wiles—Rotten Bradford Pear, he used 19-20 coats of CA glue to stabilize it. The finish is the Beall Buffing System.



Kurt Dekker—Three cedar mushrooms from an old fence post. A ball and cup toss game and two acorns (one of them is a spinning top).
