January Demonstration

Kurt Dekker demonstrated how to turn two types of tops: a spinning top and a throwing top. He likes to use a 2 inch dowel made from popular, it tends to be clean wood and free of knots. The 4 foot dowel is cut into 1 foot pieces. After creating a tenon

and loading it into the chuck he marks the dowl into 2 3/4 inch sections. He demonstrated turning the top with carbide tools and then using a spindle gouge.

Kurt turned both a standard top and a string top. Click on the video below to see the details.

Julie provided recommendations on how to decorate the tops and what products to use for best results.

Announcements/Discussion:

Dennis Feldkirchner has glue for sale at the display table.

Dallas Hensley brought in the 3 dust collectors that the VA gave us, and Phil Wiles brought in 2 chucks, one with 3 sets of jaws. All items will be auctioned off today at the break.

Phil Wiles is replacing the bearing in the old club lathe so it can be sold.

Steve Wagner brought in samples of cut green wood noting that it is so much easier to turn.

His "tip of the day" is to turn green wood, then put it on a shelf to dry. After about 2 months, the moisture content will be down to about 12% so turning can be completed. He reminded everyone to mark the center point so item can be rechucked in the same position.

Demonstration:

Kurt Dekker demonstrated how to turn tops, both spinning and throwing types. He uses a four foot poplar dowel cut into one foot lengths. Each one foot length makes 4 tops. He demonstrated spinning each one as well as one thrown with a string. All of them spun amazingly well.

Don't forget to bring in a top next month for the spinning contest. There will be contests for each type of top, spinning, throwing and string. Also remember to bring in a hand made name tag. We will be voting on the best one.

The 50/50 award was \$70 this month and the lucky winner was Jeff Fairchild.
