Red Murr won the \$70.00 50/50 drawing.

March Demonstration

Phil Wiles demonstrated how to turn a natural edged bowl.

He started with a blank from a freshly cut tree. A worm screw was used to attach to the bark side of the sawn blank to the chuck, this allowed Phil to shape the bottom of the bowl and create a tenon. After removing the worm screw he used the tenon to mount the bowl and trued up the bottom using a sheer cut. Then began by clearing out the bark on the top starting from the inside and working out until he had just 1/4 inch of the bark remaining. In order to help the bark stay on, he applied CA glue to it.

To sand the bowl he used a drill, turning the lathe up to a higher speed to sand the wings reduces the presser on them. He also runs the lathe in reverse to reduce potentially catching your



hands and direct dust away. Once finished with sanding with the lathe turning, he made sure to sand out any tool marks.

A jam chuck was used to remove the tenon and in proper fashion he removed the nib with a flick of his finger! Phil donated the finished bowl in the raffle!



Additional comments from the audience:

• Ron Ufkes remarked that the best wood for a live edge bowl is Sassafras or Cherry.

• "When a live edge doesn't hold, it becomes a natural edge." Steve Wagner

Rex Guynn—Mulberry burl with turquoise resin filler and a Cherry bowl with an inlayed abalone rim.




