## **Meeting Minutes September 9th**

### **Announcements:**

- Steve thanked Linda, Sandy and Bob for the excellent job they do for our monthly newsletter.
- Steve reminded members that we need nominations for President and Vice President in October. The election will be in November.
- We need demonstration suggestions for next year. Steve will help Phil organize the demos.
- Sandy will bring in a Christmas Pot Luck sign-up sheet to the next meeting. Please be thinking of what else will make our Christmas Party a success.
- Rodger brought in a suggested agenda to help organize our meetings.
- Steve noted that we need a chuck for the lathe we repurchased for the club. Grizzly's has one for about \$100.00. Steve will check with Velar for a cheaper price.
- Remember that we need Christmas ornaments and other items to sell at the Craft Show in November.

## **Meeting Minutes September 9th**

### Show and Tell:

- Steve Box elder bowl with tenon still attached so the piece can dry before sanding, and a box of Christmas bells.
- Terry Three items from one piece of wood, including a bowl and a phone amplifier.
- Bill Several pens, noting that the ones he made from olive wood were especially nice. The kits came with different diameter tubes and several different styles.
- Matt Crochet hooks. He also showed a center-finder guide he made for spindles.
- Jerry Pepper mill made from wood that Ken Higgins had given him.
- Dallas Bowl made from the core piece from the large yew bowl he's working on.
- Rodger Square jewelry box with inserts. Rodger is donating this item to the club for the sale table.
- Rodger won the gift certificate.

### **Demonstration:**

Phil demonstrated how to turn an offset Christmas tree. He began with a 3x3x8 inch piece of maple wood. He used a ½" bowl gouge and a spindle gouge made into a very sharp detail tool. He also shared his pattern guide for moving the axis between each segment. Phil noted that "if" you need to sand, it should be done before moving to the next segment. Good lighting is essential for this project because of the shadowing.

The next demonstration will be on texturing utilizing both club lathes. Phil is donating a texturing tool and will use it next month.

# **September Demonstration**

Phil Wiles demonstrated how to turn a spiral Christmas Tree. He started with a 3 x 3 x 8 inch block of maple. Before starting he marked on the bottom (that would be on the tail stock) with the following marks for offsetting. Note 2 is the center.

(The diagram (to right) illustrates how you should mark the bottom of the turning.)


### 2 – is center!

1 - is 1  $1/8^{th}$  to the right of 2 3 - is  $7/8^{th}$  to the left of 2 4 - is  $7/8^{th}$  to the left of 3

5 - is 3/4" to the left of 4

6- - is 3/4" to the left of 5

7 - is 5/8" to the left of 6





Taking the 3x3x8 inch blank he rounded the blank. Now he was ready to start cutting the branches. He started at the #2 position on the tail stock.

Turning at 1200 rpm and using a ½ bowl gouge Phil started creating the limb ring levels. Taking light cuts he created a tree limb level and used a "very sharp" detail gouge to finish the level so he didn't have to sand it! (Note, if you don't get as fine a cut as Phil be sure to sand each ring before cutting the next one.) As he moved up the tree he reduced by approximately 1/8 inch the diameter from the prior ring and moved

the tail stock center each time (he moved the tail stock in this pattern 2, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7).

When he was at the 4<sup>th</sup> ring he started taking the diameter down across the remainder of

the block. Then on the 7<sup>th</sup> ring, he took it down to as close a point as possible and used a cutter to top it off. Phil cleaned up the bottom by sanding it with 40 grit and used 180 to take the nubs off the top of the tree.







Dallas Hensley—This is the 2nd piece Dallas has made from this Yew bush. This is from the Yew root and required 5 quarts of epoxy to fill the cracks. He had lots of challenges to get to the final product, but it was well worth it!

The color combination created an inviting finish!



Rodger Repta—Built this lovely square jewelry box on the lathe.

He has donated it to the Club for the Craft Fest sale.






Jerry Hankins—Salt/Pepper mill from laminated Maple/Walnut/Maple/Cherry (wood from Kenneth Higgins)! Finish: CA/Lacquer.







Steve Wagner—Two Box Elder with "red" flame bowls. Turned wet and will let dry then remove the tenon. Christmas Bells from scraps, these will be donated to the club for the Craft Show in November.

Jeff Smith—Vase 8" diameter by 24" tall. Canary and padauk wood finished with a CA.
